Doing Star Diving Club proud, down at the Gavin Brown Love to Dive 2024

Congratulations to our team of 16 divers who competed at this year's Gavin Brown Love To Dive competition at the Quays in Southampton. With medals up for grabs to the top six in each event, more than half our team here made their way to the podium afterwards. Each event features six rounds: three dives from 1m and three dives from 3m. In E Female (8/9 years), Pollyanna and Lucy got the team off to a good start by coming fourth (145.60) and sixth respectively (127.80).

In D Female (10/11 years), Elodie claimed the gold on 149.75. In D Open, Oliver won the event on 152.80 and Barnabas was fifth on 132.15.

In C Female (12/13 years), the biggest event of the competition with 29 divers, Sophie was fourth on 159.55 and Lucia sixth on 155.75. Martha came eighth on 152.45, Willa 12th on 146.80, Jamie 13th on 145.90, Emily 27th on 114.00 and Louisa – who has just moved up to novice squad – 28th on 112.55.

In B+ Female (14/16 years), Mable claimed the bronze on 170.75, Amy-Jules was fifth on 163.10 and Katarina came eighth on 143.10. James won the B+ Open event on 168.40.

COMPETITION RESULTS

We had a "Groovy" Armada Cup in Plymouth!

Well done to our team of eight divers who travelled to the South West to compete at this year's Armada Cup competition.

Hosted by **Plymouth Diving** at the **Plymouth Life Centre**, this four-day open club meet features events for age group and elite junior divers.

The top six from the morning and lunchtime prelims went through to the finals later in the day. A few events here were run as straight finals.

On the first day of competition, **Alex** got the team off to a great start by winning the Group A (16/18) open age group 3m on 294.70. In the Group B (14/15) open age group 3m, **Leo** was fifth in the prelim on 236.05 and took the bronze in the final on 112.80. In the Group D (9/11) female age

group platform, Lily came third in the prelim on 144.00 and claimed bronze in the final on 84.20. Tegan won both the prelim and the final of the Group A female age group 1m, scoring 279.15 and 110.95 respectively.

Day two began with Alex competing in the Group A open age group Im, claiming the silver on a score of 268.35. In the Group B open age group Im, Leo was ninth in the prelim on 212.75. In the Group A female age group platform, Tegan came fourth in the prelim on 219.65 and went on to take the bronze in the final on 108.10. In the Group C (12/13) female age group Im, Sophia was second in the prelim on 196.30 and finished sixth in the final on 64.20. Florence came 20th in the prelim on 148.00. In the Group B/A (14/18) open 3m synchro, Alex paired up

Day three started with Caitlin competing in the Group A female elite junior 3m event, coming 16th in the

East Region Skills 2024

Congratulations to our team of 13 divers who competed at the East Region Skills competition in Southend.

This was the first opportunity for our divers to try to qualify for this year's **National Skills Finals** to be held in mid-July, in Southend.

Our skills divers competed at the first regional skills event of the year on the **24th March**. We took at team of 13 divers to Southend who were the hosts of this years East Regional Skills Championships. This was the divers first chance to try and make their qualifying points for the National Skills finals in the summer.

First up was **Polly** in girls Group E event. Polly dived beautifully to win the event with a fantastic overall score and qualifying her for the nationals later this year! Next up was the group D divers, **Barns** and **Elodie**. This was both these divers first time competing at this level, and they gained valuable competition experience and showed off some

impressive dives to finish 5th and 9th respectively. The biggest event of the day with 36 divers was girls group C. We had 6 divers in this event with the following placing's Lara 29th, Jamie 23rd, Willa 11th, Sophie 9th, Lucia 4th and Martha 3rd! Martha showed off some very consistent diving to place on the podium in such a large event in her first skills competition. We were very proud of all the other 5 girls with each diver scoring 7 or above in at least one of their dives! To finish the day we had our group B girls Mable, AJ, Scarlet and Isla. The girls were very impressive in this event and came 15th, 3rd, 2nd and 1st respectively. Star took home the 1st, 2nd, & 3rd to round up the day with AJ, Scarlet and Isla all making their points to attend Nationals in July! Well done all divers who competed! We are so very proud of all the divers and we hope everyone enjoyed the day and gained valuable experience

Lily and Alex had their second and last DiSe Camp in Birmingham which focused on their competition lists in preparation for the upcoming competition season. They also had access to a variety of workshops from the Swim England's psychology, physio and S&C team. The DiSe programme provides a comprehensive syllabus to support 17/19yr old athletes to achieve their full potential within the NGB talent pathway, as well as their future career. Successful completion results in a prestigious recognised qualification worth 64 UCAS points.

Surrey ASA Diving Skills 🔀

Jan 2024 - Guildford

Well done to our team of 17 divers who got the new year competition programme underway with some great performances and results at the Surrey County ASA Diving Skills Competition at Guildford Spectrum.







Some of our divers here have only just moved up to squad level and were representing the club 'externally' for the first time.

Lucy got the team off to a solid start in the first session by winning E Female (8/9 years) on 141.70. Also competing in session one was **Elodie**, who claimed the gold in D Female (10/11 years) on 148.95. In session two, **Barnabas** won D Open (10/11 years) on 147.75 and **Oliver Blandford-Gange** took the Surrey silver on 130.90. Meanwhile **Oliver Halliday** won the Surrey gold in the C Open (12/13 years) on 135.40.

In C Female (12/13 years), the biggest event of the meet with 24 divers, the results were split afterwards into C1 (12 years) and C2 (13 years). In C1, Lucia claimed the Surrey gold on 135.35 and Emily took the Surrey silver on 127.60. In C2, it was one, two and three on the podium for our divers. Willa claimed gold on 146.30, Jamie the silver on 145.70 and Martha a bronze on 144.85.

In the fourth and final session, which featured Group B (14/15 years) and Group A (16/18 years), it was another one, two and three on the podium for our team. In B Female, Amy-Jules won the event on 149.80, Katarina claimed the silver on 140.25 and Mable the bronze on 138.30.

Riley, who has just moved up to novice squad, was fourth on 126.45. In B Open, Eddison claimed a Surrey gold on 117.45. In Group A, **Ava** won the Surrey gold in the female category on 129.15 and James the gold in the open category on 138.90.

Any idea who from our team got the highest 'raw score' in the competition (three judges' scores added together, before being multiplied by the degree of difficulty)? Amy-Jules scored 25.50 for



an impressive V-sit hold on poolside.

Emily was right behind her, scoring 25.00 for her pike jump from poolside.

There was friendly competition from outside Surrey this year from 'guests' Amersham Swimming Club, Havering Cormorants Diving Club, Luton Diving Club, Maidstone Diving Team and Tunbridge Wells Diving C.
